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INTRODUCTION

The Education Statistical Digest is an annual publication of the Corporate Planning Unit of the Department of Education, Innovation and Gender Relations (DOEIGR). The 2018 Digest analyses data reflecting the academic year, which commenced in September 2017 and ended in July 2018. This Digest depicts trends and projections in various sub-sectors of the education system. The Digest can be used by Policy Makers, Planners, Researchers and other personnel to make rational assumptions and sound decisions for the education system in Saint Lucia. Copies of the Digest can be requested from the Department or found on the Ministry's website, www.education.gov.lc.

The production of the Statistical Digest commenced with the distribution of Annual Education Census Questionnaires to public and private schools at all levels specifying that data reported must reflect what existed on October 15, 2017, unless otherwise specified. Additional sources of data included the Central Statistics Office, the Government's Annual Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure and the various units of the DOEIGR.

The 2018 Digest highlights data on various constituents and components of the education sector. It reports on student enrolment, dropouts, repeaters and graduates. Data are included on teachers, local and regional examinations, education financing and student welfare programmes. The data compiled are used to calculate indicators which are necessary to monitor the progress of numerous targets and goals such as the monitoring indicators for the 2015-2020 Education Sector Development Plan. These indicators are used by the DOEIGR and National Government as well as regional and international agencies such as the OECS, Caribbean Development Bank, World Bank, UNICEF and UNESCO. They assist in the monitoring, evaluation and review of the education system's progress in achieving its targets and goals for example Education for All (EFA), Millennium Development Goals (MDG) and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The DOEIGR is grateful for the assistance provided by education officers, principals and other ministry personnel. We look forward to your continued cooperation in the provision of accurate and timely data for future publication and the advancement of our education system.

SUMMARY

Early Childhood Education (ECE)

Early Childhood Education Centres provide services to children within the age range of 0-4 years. However, there are instances where older children attend these centres. ECE centres are categorized as daycare centres and preschools. Daycare centres provide child care services to children 0-2 years old while preschool centres provide services to children who are 3-4 years old. The target age groups and services offered by these institutions may overlap. Both are encouraged to follow the structured curriculum prescribed by the Early Childhood Services Unit of the DOEIGR. As new schools open and others close, the number of centres may fluctuate from year to year.

Day Care Centres

For the academic year 2017/18, there were thirty-seven (37) daycare centres; two (2) less than the previous academic year. Daycare centres are both Government and privately owned. There was a decrease of one (1) centre at both the Government-owned and private centres compared to the previous year. The total enrolment was one thousand, three hundred and eighty-one (1381) students, a decrease of 10.1% in contrast to the previous year. Government-owned centres recorded a decrease of 11.8% and privately owned centres recorded a decrease of 8.2% in enrolment. The male to female student ratio and the caregiver to student ratio remained the same as the previous year, approximately 1:1 and 1:10 respectively. The Castries region again recorded the highest student enrolment (698), which represents approximately 50.5% of the daycare population.

Preschool Centres

There were ninety-four (94) preschools in operation during the 2017/18 academic year; five (5) less than the previous year. All preschools centres are privately owned. These centres enrolled three thousand, four hundred and eighty-two (3482) students, whi

ch represents ninety (90) students less than the previous year. Of the total enrollment figure, approximately 51% were female. As in the previous year, the teacher/student ratio and the average number of teachers per centre remained at 1:10 and 4 respectively. The gross enrolment rate for the year 2017/18 was 85.0%.

Public Primary Education

Primary education is compulsory for all children and the formal school age ranges from five (5) to eleven (11) years. There was a 1.3% decrease in enrolment from fifteen thousand and eightynine (15,089) in 2016/17 to fourteen thousand, eight hundred and ninety-four (14,894) in 2017/18. There has been a consistent decline in primary school enrolment over the last eighteen years. This can be partly attributed to a steady decline in the school-aged population over the past years. The male to female student ratio remained at approximately 1:1.

The gross enrolment rate increased from 94% in 2016/17 to 95% in 2017/18. There continues to be a number of under-aged and over-aged students in the primary schools. This year, the percentage of under-aged students was 23.1% and over-aged students 13.5% of the public primary population. The net enrolment rate in public primary schools increased from 87% in 2016/17 to 89% in 2017/18. This means that there was an increase of two percentage points of 5-11 year olds enrolled in public primary schools. Forty-three (43) five year old students were enrolled in early childhood institutions. Four hundred and thirty-two (432) ten and eleven year old students were enrolled in secondary schools.

In 2017/18, the primary education recurrent expenditure was \$63.2 million, a slight decrease of 0.3% from the previous year. As in previous years since 1997, the unit expenditure per student increased in 2017/18. This period registered an increase of 1% taking the amount to four thousand, two hundred and forty-one Eastern Caribbean dollars (\$4241).

School leavers are students who have left school by way of dropouts and transfers out of Saint Lucia. At the public primary schools, there were eight (8) dropouts and eighty-six (86) transfers during the academic year 2016/17. This represents an increase of one student in the dropout and

an increase of seventeen (17) students transferred from the previous year. In 2016/17, males accounted for 62.5% of the dropouts and 62.7% of the transfers.

There were four hundred and forty-nine (449) repeaters at public primary schools in 2017/18, out of which 62% were boys. It should be noted that there was a decrease of 16.4% in the number of repeaters from 2016/17 to 2017/18. The majority of the repeaters were from the Grade K (222 students) and Grade Three (59 students) classes. At the district level, the highest percentage of repeaters was recorded in District Seven.

The Student Support Services Unit of the DOEIGR provides assistance in the form of bursaries and the School Feeding Programme to needy students in public primary schools. One thousand six hundred and ninety eight (1698) or 11.4% of the students from public primary schools benefited from bursaries in 2017/18. The School Feeding Programme is operational at seventy (70) of the seventy-four (74) public primary schools. In 2017/18, five thousand seven hundred and eighty seven (5787) students or 39% of the public primary students benefited from the School Feeding Programme. District Seven recorded the highest percentage (74%) of students benefiting from the programme while District Two recorded the lowest (12%).

The National Common Entrance Examination (CEE) is a primary school exit exam written annually by Grade Six students. In 2018, two thousand two hundred and twenty four (2224) students wrote this exam, a decrease of thirty-four (34) students as compared to 2017. Of the students who sat the CEE, one thousand one hundred and forty-one (1141) or about 51% were males. The national mean was 60.1% - a decrease of 0.5 percentage points in contrast to the 2017 national mean of 60.6%. One thousand one hundred and eighty-six (1186) or 53% of the students scored at or above the national mean.

National assessments are also conducted in Grade Two and Four. These assessments, called the Minimum Standard Exams, comprise of a school based assessment (SBA) component. The SBA has a weighting of 20% of the overall assessment score. For 2017/18, one thousand, three hundred and thirty-eight (1338) students or about sixty-six percent (66%) of the two thousand and thirty-seven (2037) candidates scored at or above the minimum standard of 60% at the Grade

Two level while one thousand three hundred and thirteen (1313) or 62% of the Grade Four students scored at or above the minimum standard of 60%. The national composite means for the Grade Two and Grade Four national assessments were 66.2% and 63.2% respectively.

For the academic year 2017/18, there were one thousand and four (1004) public primary school teachers, a decrease of eighteen (18) teachers over the previous academic year. The percentage of female teachers remained at eighty-six percent (86%). The total number of trained teachers slightly decreased from nine hundred and fourteen (914) in 2016/17 to nine hundred and seven (907) in 2017/18. District Five recorded the highest percentage (95%) of trained teachers while District Four and Eight recorded the lowest percentage (86%).

Over the past years, in an effort to improve the quality of education in the primary sector, along with regular classroom teachers, specialist teachers were assigned to public primary schools. Areas of specialization include Special Education, Music, French, and Physical Education. Where the capacity and resources are available other specialist teachers are attached to teach other areas, e.g. Information Technology, Theatre Arts and Spanish. In 2017/18, a total of 263 specialist teachers were recorded. In addition to the normal teacher-student ratio, an effective teacher-student ratio was calculated which does not include these specialist teachers. The average teacher-student ratio in public primary schools in 2017/18 was 1:15 while the effective teacher-student ratio was 1:20.

Public Secondary Education

In 2017/18, there were twenty-two (22) public secondary schools in operation, one (1) less than the previous year. Due to declining enrolments, the George Charles Secondary and Jon Odlum Secondary schools were amalgamated to form the Stanley Jon Odlum Memorial Secondary School.

For the period under review, eleven thousand, five hundred and fifty-one (11551) students were enrolled in the public secondary schools; a decrease of 3.3% from the previous year. The male to female student ratio remained at approximately 1:1. The formal age of students attending public secondary schools is twelve (12) to sixteen (16) years.

The Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) and Net Enrolment Ratio (NER) were 89% and 82% respectively in 2017/18. It must be noted that there were four hundred and three (403) 12-16 year old students enrolled in primary schools which affected the secondary school NER.

There were two hundred and twelve (212) school leavers in 2016/17. This figure includes students who dropped out and transferred out of Saint Lucia. The number of dropouts decreased from two hundred and forty-two (242) in 2015/16 to one hundred and sixty-one (161) in 2016/17. As in the previous years, the male dropout rate was higher than that for females. Males accounted for approximately 62% of the total dropouts. Forms Four and Five continue to record the highest percentage of dropouts accounting for 73% of the total dropouts.

The recurrent expenditure on secondary education in 2017/18 was \$72.6 million, an increase of 3.6% from the previous year. This resulted in the expenditure per pupil also increasing from five thousand, eight hundred and sixty-nine dollars (\$5869) in 2016/17 to six thousand, two hundred and eighty-four dollars (\$6284) in 2017/18.

There were one thousand and six (1006) secondary school teachers in 2017/18, fifteen (15) less than the previous year. Seventy seven percent (77%) of these teachers were trained, a lower percentage than the 90% recorded for primary school teachers. Out of the one thousand and six (1006) teachers 71% were female and 70% were graduate. The public secondary school teacher-student ratio slightly increased from 1:12 in 2016/17 to 1:11 in 2017/18.

The Transportation Subsidy Programme and the School Feeding Programme were the welfare programmes offered to students attending public secondary schools. Of the eleven thousand, four hundred and twenty-two (11422) students enrolled at public secondary schools, two thousand, six hundred and ninety (2690) or 24% benefited from the Transportation Subsidy Programme. The School Feeding Programme was available at five (5) of the twenty two (22) secondary schools. A total of two hundred and fifty (250) students were beneficiaries of this programme.

Private Primary and Private Secondary Education

In 2017/18, the number of private primary and secondary schools remained the same, six (6) and two (2) respectively. The six private primary schools were Tapion, Bonne Terre, Montessouri, Castries SDA, Labayee SDA, and Emmanuel SDA. However, the International School St. Lucia reported having students enrolled in a primary program. A total enrolment of nine hundred and eighty (980) students and seventy-three (73) teachers were recorded at the six private primary schools, which gave a teacher-student ratio of 1:13. In 2017/18, the percentages of female students and female teachers were approximately 51% and 95% respectively. The Castries SDA once again recorded the highest enrolment for the year.

In addition to the two (2) private secondary schools, SDA Academy and the International School St. Lucia, the Bonne Terre Preparatory School reported on students pursuing a secondary programme. The total private secondary schools' enrolment decreased from two hundred and eighty-seven (287) in 2016/17 to two hundred and forty-two (242) in 2017/18, while the total number of teachers remained the same at thirty-two (32) for the same period. Fifty eight percent (58%) of the students and seven eight percent (78%) of the teachers were female. The teacher-student ratio was 1:8. The SDA Academy recorded sixty six percent (66%) of the total enrolment of the private secondary schools.

Secondary School Exams

Aside from their regular class assessments, students at the secondary level also sat other examinations. In 2011, one of the local examinations, the Form Three Minimum Standards was discontinued and replaced with the Caribbean Certificate of Secondary Level Competence (CCSLC) examination. CCSLC assesses students' competence in six subjects namely; English, Mathematics, French, Integrated Science, Social Studies and Spanish. The quality of grades is measured based on three competency levels; Master, Competent and Developing Competence. In 2018, thirteen percent (13%) of students achieved competence at the "Master" level, sixty one percent (61%) at the "Competent" level and twenty six percent (26%) at the "Developing Competence" level.

The overall pass rate at the General and Technical Proficiency levels in the 2018 CSEC examinations was 76.5%, a 3.2% point increase over 2017. There were increases in the pass rates at fifteen (15) of the twenty-two (22) secondary schools with increases ranging from 0.5% to 25%.

Special Education

Special education centres in Saint Lucia cater for students with special needs including developmental and sensory impairments. Specialized education programmes are delivered at five (5) centres namely the Blind Welfare Association, Lady Gordon Opportunity Centre, Dunnottar School, Soufriere Special Education Centre and Vieux Fort Special Education Centre. The total student enrolment and total number of teachers for 2017/18 were three hundred and ninety-five (395) and sixty-eight (68) respectively. Forty-one percent (41%) of students enrolled were female. The teacher-student ratio at the special education centres remained the same as the previous year at 1:6. There were fifty-one (51) trained teachers in 2017/18, an increase of ten (10) teachers from the previous year.

Skills Training

The National Skills Development Centre (NSDC) offers services and training in a variety of areas such as career counseling, technical vocational skills training, job search workshops and job attachments and placements. In 2017/18, four hundred and forty-five (445) trainees were enrolled at the NSDC. Of these, seventy-six (76) were enrolled under the Single Mothers in Life Enhancing Skills (SMILES), two hundred and fifty-six (256) were enrolled under the Youth Empowerment Project (YEP) and one hundred and thirteen (113) Empowerment of South Eastern Residents Through Training in Non-Traditional Areas (ESERTNA). Three hundred and six (306) or sixty-nine percent (69%) of the trainees were females. Twenty-one (21) tutors were employed at the centres, out of which nine (9) were females.

The Centre for Adolescent Rehabilitation and Education (CARE) also provides technical and vocational skills training and has four (4) centres across the island. In 2017/18, CARE had an enrolment of one hundred and thirty-seven (137) students, which was a seven percent (7%) decrease from the previous year. Eighteen percent (18%) of the student population was female.

The teacher-student ratio was 1:8. Skill courses are normally offered in the second and third years of the programme. In 2017/18, seventy (70) or fifty-one percent (51%) of the students were enrolled in these courses.

National Enrichment and Learning Programme (NELP)

The National Enrichment and Learning Unit (NELU) is responsible for the NELP, which is offered in two phases. In 2017/18, students were able to pursue the NELP from sixteen (16) centres, two (2) more than the 2016/17 period. The total enrolment at these centres was one thousand, six hundred and nineteen (1619), a twenty-seven percent (27%) increase over the previous year. Females represented approximately 75% of the total learners from both phases. The programme with the highest enrolment was CSEC Mathematics with two hundred and sixty-two (262) learners.

Phase One utilized seventy-five (75) facilitators. Facilitator-learner ratio was 1:12. There were sixty-seven (67) dropouts recorded from Phase One. Five hundred and nine (509) learners from this phase graduated. Approximately 76% of these graduates were females. Phase Two utilized seventy (70) facilitators. Facilitator-Learner ratio was 1:10. Seventy-one percent (71%) of the facilitators from the two phases were female.

Post-Secondary and Tertiary Education

Post-secondary and tertiary programmes are offered at the Sir Arthur Lewis Community College (SALCC), the Vieux Fort Post-Secondary Department, the Vieux-Fort Comprehensive Secondary, A' Level Department, Monroe College, UWI Open Campus and three offshore Medical Schools namely: the International American University (IAU) College of Medicine, American International Medical University (AIM-U), Spartan Health Sciences University School of Medicine.

Sir Arthur Lewis Community College - SALCC

The SALCC offered a wide range of post-secondary and tertiary education programmes. In 2017/18, the enrolment was one thousand, eight hundred and sixty-six (1,866) compared to two thousand, two hundred and seven (2,207) in 2016/17. This meant a 15% decrease in enrollment.

The Department of Technical Education and Management Studies (DTEMS) recorded the highest enrolment (55% of the 1,866 students enrolled). It must be noted that the enrollment figure does not include students registered at the Department of Continuing Education (DOCE). The DOCE offers many courses including the Defensive Driving and other stand-alone courses at the CSEC level.

Vieux Fort Post-Secondary Department and Vieux-Fort Comprehensive A' Level

In 2014/15, the Vieux Fort Post-Secondary Department which was previously located on the compounds of the Vieux Fort Comprehensive Secondary School, Campus B, was relocated to the site where the Vieux-Fort Comprehensive Secondary School (VFCSS), Campus A was previously located. However, the A' Level department continues to be housed at the VFCSS. The Post-Secondary Department offers Business, Secretarial and Carpentry/Joinery programmes to students graduating from secondary school. The 2017/18 enrolment at the Vieux-Fort Post-Secondary was one hundred and forty (140) with the majority (57%) of the students enrolled in the Business Studies programmes. There was an enrolment of one hundred and twenty nine (129) students at the A' Level Department.

Monroe College

Monroe College opened its doors in Saint Lucia in 2007, offering undergraduate and graduate programmes. The College recorded an enrolment of two hundred and nine (209) students and eighteen (18) teachers in the 2016 Fall (September to December) semester. One hundred and thirty-six (136) or sixty-five percent (65%) of the students were female. The Bachelors in Business Management recorded the highest enrolment accounting for thirty five percent (35%) of the student population. Twenty-four (24) students graduated at the end of the 2016 fall semester.

Medical Schools

The three above-mentioned offshore medical schools offer four and five year medical programmes including MD (Doctor of Medicine) programmes. In 2017/18, data was received from only two out of the three schools namely the Spartan Health Sciences University School of Medicine and the International American University (IAU). A total of three hundred and eleven (311) students were enrolled in these two institutions. The majority of students enrolled in these

programmes were from India (60%) followed by St. Lucia then the United States America (USA). In 2017/18, the student enrolment at Spartan Health Sciences University decreased to two hundred and forty (240), which marks a forty-one percent (41%) decrease from the previous year. The enrolment at IAU also decreased by 45% from one hundred and twenty-eight (128) to seventy-one (71) students. There were fifty-four (54) teachers at these two schools with approximately forty one percent (41%) being full time. Males represented fifty percent (50%) of the total number of teachers.

Tertiary Level Examinations

Students from the SALCC and A' Level Department of the VFCSS wrote the Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examinations (CAPE) in 2018. The overall pass rate at SALCC was 96.8% in Unit 1. This represents an increase of 4.7 percentage point from the last year. The pass rate attained for Unit Two was 96.7%. VFCSS attained a pass rate of 96.0% in Unit One and 98.8% in Unit Two. This represents increases of 0.3 and 7.5 percentage points respectively over the year 2017.

Education Financing

For the financial year 2017/18, one hundred and eighty-one point three (181.3) million dollars was allocated to the DOEIGR for both recurrent and capital expenditure. This represented approximately 12% of the 2017/18 national budget, a 0.1% decrease over the previous year. Thirty-nine point eight percent (39.8%) of Education's budget was allocated to secondary education, thirty-four point seven percent (34.7%) to primary education, eight point six percent (8.6%) to tertiary education and approximately one point four percent (1.4%) to ECE. In 2017/18, the Department's expenditure as a percentage of GDP was at 3.9%, a slight decrease of 0.1 percentage points from the previous year 2016/17. From 2005/06, Education recurrent expenditure as a percentage of total government recurrent expenditure has been less than twenty percent (20%).

Teacher Attrition

During the 2016/17 academic year, fifty-one (51) primary and sixty-one (61) secondary school teachers left the service due to resignation, termination, retirement and secondment among other

reasons. The percentage of teacher leavers at the primary schools decreased by 0.6% percentage points from the previous year while that of secondary schools increased by 1.4% percentage points. In 2016/17, there were ten (10) primary school teachers on study leave, all being on study leave without pay. This represents a slight increase of two (2) teachers over the previous year's number of eight (8) teachers on study leave. At the secondary schools, eighteen (18) teachers were on study leave; 13 less than the previous year. The teachers on study leave included students enrolled at the Division of Teacher Education and Educational Administration of the SALCC. Approximately ten percent (10%) of the primary school teachers and twenty eight percent (28%) of the secondary school teachers on study leave were males.

Culture

Cultural groups and activities existing at schools are highlighted in the annual Digest. It was noted that four cultural groups existing at schools included, La Rose, La Marguerite, Steel Pan and Quadrille. School choir singing competitions are held at both the primary and secondary levels.

Technical Notes on Concepts and Methods

1. Age Specific Enrolment Ratio (ASER)

- ➤ The ASER gives information on the extent of participation of specific population ages in a specific level of education.
- ASER at secondary level has been calculated by relating the population, ages 10 to 19, to the enrolment of these ages in secondary schools.

2. Average Class Size of a Grade or School

This is the total enrolment of a grade or school divided by the total number of classes in that grade or school.

3. Dropout Rate

➤ The Dropout Rate is calculated by relating the number of students who dropped out during a given year to the enrolment in the beginning of the year.

4. Expenditure per Pupil/Student

Expenditure per pupil/student is calculated by dividing total expenditure allocations to a given level of education by the enrolment at that level.

5. Female Participation Rate

The percentage share of females in the total enrolment is computed to determine gender participation at a given level of education.

6. Flow Rate

- Flow Rate is calculated by following a cohort of students who join a given class in a given year and move to the next class in the subsequent year.
- ➤ When using flow model technique for projection of enrolment, flow rates are used for carrying forward students from one class in a given year to the next class in the subsequent year.

7. Graduate Teachers

A graduate teacher is a teacher with at least a recognised bachelor's degree.

8. Gross Enrolment Rate (GER)

➤ The GER gives information on the extent of participation of a specific school-going age group population in a specific level of education.

- \triangleright GER at primary level is calculated by relating population in age group 5 11 to the enrolment in primary schools.
- \triangleright GER at secondary level is calculated by relating population in age group 12-16 to the enrolment in secondary schools.

9. Infant, Junior Primary, Senior Primary

10. Infant, Primary and Combined Schools

11. Net Enrolment Rate (NER)

- ➤ The NER gives information on the extent of participation in a given level of education of children belonging to the official age-group corresponding to the given level of education.
- NER at primary level has been calculated by grade (from K to grade 6), by relating the population in ages 5 to 11 to the enrolment in those grades.
- NER at secondary level has been calculated by form (1 to 5), by relating the population in ages 12 to 16 to the enrolment in those forms.

12. Percentage of Repeaters

Percentage of Repeaters is calculated by dividing the number of students repeating in a current year by the total enrolment of that year, expressed as a percentage.

13. Reference Point/Period

- Population: Population data are given for the middle of the calendar year.
- Enrolment: Student data are given for the last school day of October of a given academic year.
- ➤ Teachers: Teacher data are given for the last school day of October of a given academic year.
- Expenditure: Financial data are given for the financial year from April to March of the following year.
- > Gross Domestic Product (GDP): GDP data are given for the calendar year.

14. Repetition Rate

➤ Repetition Rate is the number of students repeating from a particular year divided by the total enrolment in the previous year.

15. School Capacity

- ➤ Physical capacity of a school is estimated at 35 pupil/students per classroom and 15 square feet per child in case of hall spaces.
- ➤ If enrolment of a school is more than its capacity then it is a case of over utilization of physical capacity.
- ➤ If enrolment of a school is less than its capacity then it is a case of underutilization of physical capacity.

16. School Size

- The size of a school is measured in terms of number of pupils/students enrolled on the last school day of October of a given year.
- Average size of a school is computed by dividing total enrolment by number of schools in a given area.

17. Teacher Utilization

- ➤ Child/Teacher ratio is the number of children per teacher in a Pre-school centre.
- ➤ Pupil/Teacher ratio is the number of pupils per teacher in a Primary school.
- ➤ Student/Teacher ratio is the number of students per teacher in a Secondary school.
- ➤ The above ratios are calculated by dividing total enrolment by the total number of teachers in the school/centre.
- ➤ The Principal, Vice Principal, Counselor, Lab Technician and Bursar of a school are not included in the number of its teaching staff.

18. Trained Teachers

A trained teacher is one who has successfully completed a recognized program in teacher education methods and teaching techniques.

Note: TIIIB teachers who pursued the Special Intensive Teacher Training Program were counted as trained teachers from 2007/08.
































