

MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND FISHERIES, VETERINARY AND LIVESTOCK SERVICES DIVISION CONDITIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF RABBITS INTO ST. LUCIA

- 1. An Import Permit has to be obtained from the Veterinary and Livestock Services Division in St. Lucia before Importation.
- 2. Rabbits should be accompanied by a Veterinary Health certificate issued by a certified Veterinarian attached to the Veterinary Authority of the exporting country.
- 3. Rabbits should be born and bred in the country for which Import Permit is granted and must be exported directly to St. Lucia. They should be healthy and treated for External and Internal Parasites including Coccidia.
- 4. Rabbits must be examined on the day of export and certified free of all major infectious and contagious diseases as well as Internal and external parasites (particularly Ear mites)
- 5. There should have been no outbreaks of Tularemia or Myxomatosis within one (1) year of export.
- 6. Animals and documents must be presented to the Government Veterinary Officer at one of the following ports on arrival:
 - George FL Charles Airport
 - Hewanorra International Airport
 - Castries and Vieux Sea Ports.
