

MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND FISHERIES, VETERINARY AND LIVESTOCK SERVICES DIVISION CONDITIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF SHEEP AND GOATS INTO ST. LUCIA

1. Sheep/Goats were born and raised in the country from which it will be exported directly into St. Lucia and will be accompanied by a Health Certificate which will contain the information required.

2. SUCH HEALTH CERTIFICATE SHALL STATE:

- a) Country has been free from foot and Mouth Disease for a period of at least five (5) years prior to the date of exportation of sheep/goat, as well as free from Rinderpest and Pestes Des Petitis Ruminants.
- b) Sheep/Goat were examined on the day of shipment and are physically sound and in good health and free of symptoms of Rabies, Scrapie/Contagious Caprine Pleuropneumonia, Caprine Arthritis and Encephalitis Syndrome (C.A.E.) and any other prescribed infectious or contagious disease.
- c) Sheep/Goat(s) have been subjected to tuberculin test with a negative reaction within ten (10) days immediately prior to exportation.
- d) Sheep/goat(s) have been subjected with negative reactions to a serum agglutination test, with internationally approved antigens, for Brucellosis, during the thirty (30) days prior to exportation.
- e) Goats have been tested negative for Carpine Arthritis and Encephalitis Syndrome (C.A.E)
- f) Sheep/Goat(s) are to be treated for internal and external parasites with approved drugs prior to export.
- 3. Sheep/Goat(s) and accompanying documents will be examined by The Veterinary Officials at the port of entry prior to release.
