CONDITIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF PET BIRDS INTO ST. LUCIA

- 1. The birds can only be imported through the Seaports of Castries and Vieux Fort or the George FL Charles and Hewanorra Airport.
- 2. The birds must be accompanied by an **Import Permit** obtained from the Veterinary and Livestock Services Division at the request of the prospective importer or his/her representative.
- 3. Birds must be accompanied by a **Health Certificate** issued within 48 hours of importation and signed by the Government Veterinary officials in the **Country of Origin.**
- 4. The Veterinary Certificate as in (3) above shall state that:
 - i. The birds have been inspected on the day of exportation and found to be healthy and free from clinical signs of any infectious/contagious disease.
 - ii. There has been no outbreak of New Castle Disease or Avian Influenza (fowl Plague) in the country of origin for the past three (3) years.
 - iii. The birds were kept in isolation in a facility approved by the Veterinary officials of exporting country for 21 days prior to export and showed no clinical signs of infectious disease.
 - iv. During the isolation period in **iii**) above, the birds were tested for Avian Influenza, Newcastle Disease and Psittacosis and test results were negative.
- 5. Birds must be exported directly to St. Lucia and must not come into contact with any other animals along the way except such for which a similar permit has been granted.
- 6. On arrival in St. Lucia, animals and documents must be inspected by a Veterinary Inspector prior to release.
